
I sincerely wish the worst of the pandemic is behind us and the monastery can resume its normal operations swiftly.







# PROGRAMMES & ACTIVITIES

Year 2021 was a challenging year, with the covid-19 pandemic continuing to affect most part of the world. With the experience gained during year 2020, our team was able to conduct all our pujas and events online with even greater ease and capabilities. We saw many of our devotees spending their time staying home and devoting their time to virtuous learning. It was heartening to know that our devotees are keeping their spirits high and spending their time meaningfully amidst the challenging times.

On top of that, in line with our Monastery's vision of "Serving the Community", the C-19 Task force was set up to provide care and support to covid-19-affected students and their families. Through caring and supporting the affected students, the task force team could put what they had learnt during Dharma classes to use. It was an opportunity to cultivate compassion like that of the Buddha. They could also better appreciate the blessings of the leisurely life they have, and to make the best of their time practising and accumulating positive karma through their actions.

We wrapped up the year with 9615 pujas and events (all online) conducted and saw a total of 536,354 attendees.

## **C19 TASKFORCE**

In Sep 21, Venerable Jing Yuan directed the set up of the C-19 task force to provide assistance to infected individuals and family members, as he had foreseen an impending wave of infections.

Within a short period of two months, the C-19 task force provided care to around 500 infected individuals and others who 700 quarantine care. The task force dispensed free lung detoxification soup and immune care herbal tea to them and helped offer blessing tablets. The Sangha also prayed fervently for the fast recovery of the sick.


The C-19 task force allowed the team members to appreciate the blessings of their leisurely life, and to fully utilise their time to practise and accumulate positive karma through their actions.

## COMMUNITY CARE

Providing community care is an important aspect of BW Monastery's welfare outreach program. Through year round gifting and outreach events, we aim to strengthen and promote the community spirit of compassion and generosity.

In 2021, BW Monastery teamed up with Admiralty Grassroots, sponsors and volunteers to provide "care" packages to the needy households in Sembawang GRC and Admiralty. Blossom "C.A.R.E" packs were also distributed to isolated seniors to keep them mentally and emotionally engaged.

BW Monastery also assisted in providing Financial Assistance Scheme to low income households who have lost employment due to C-19 and/or with temporary physical disability. This helps to cushion the financial difficulties faced by the them through providing temporary monetary reliefs.

BW Monastery is immensely grateful to the compassionate volunteers who contributed to the success of the Community Care events.









## OX-PICIOUS CNY 2021

The Lunar New Year is no simple affair at our monastery. It is an important time whereby devotees would welcome the new year by paying respect to all Buddhas, repent past non-virtuous deeds, and make offerings to receive more merits and wisdom in the year to come!

With Covid safe-distancing measures in place, we downscaled our Lunar New Year event and adhered to the government's guidelines. The main Shrine Hall was closed to the public, with the Venerables greeting and distributing goodie bags to the devotees near the monastery main gate. Close to 3000 devotees physically attended our Lunar New Year event over a span of three days. We also had about 260 volunteers supporting the event!

Prior to the pandemic, the "Guan Yin Lot" has always been very popular among devotees. Hence, we set up an online "Guan Yin Lot" platform for devotees to pick their lots whilst staying safe! We saw a total of about 6000 lots being drawn during the Lunar New Year period!









## AUSPICIOUS VESAK

Vesak Day is the most important day for Buddhist practitioners. The birth of Lord Buddha Shakyamuni brought cool Dharma to the world, and countless lost sentient beings have found a way of liberation.

In celebration of this special day, 150 volunteers handmade a total of 10,000 stalks of gauze tulips over a span of 8 months. These gauze tulips pieced together to form a dazzling flower field at where our main gate was. Devotees could visualize offering this field of flowers to all Buddhas and Tathagatas.

Despite not opening our shrine hall for physical activities in view of the pandemic, we saw more than 7000 devotees participate in our online prayer session on Vesak Day itself. Over 110,000 people logged onto our website to participate in virtual Buddha bathing ceremony over the course of two days. Our volunteers' hard work paid off!










# WELCOMING PRINCE SIDDHARTHA




## EXAM BLESSING




## ZEST UNIVERSE GRADUATION
