BW Monastery works towards combining Buddhism into daily living, in order to elevate human lives and spiritual minds, establish positive and active living, and to build happy families and harmonious social relationships.

In order to achieve the above, we focus on the following four core principles:

We continue to distribute care packs and give short-term monetary assistance to the elderlies living alone and needy families who are living near the Monastery. 





HIGHLIGHTS OF 2022







With the easing of covid-19 measures in year 2022, activities and lessons gradually resumed normalcy. We took a safe and prudent approach to resume our programmes and services as we wanted to safeguard the well being of our volunteers and devotees. With the experience gained during the pandemic years, our team was able to continue to conduct pujas, events and lessons online with great ease, whilst also hosting participants in-person (hybrid mode). Many of our devotees were delighted to step foot into the classrooms again, and to be able to hold Dharma-related discussions with their fellow classmates face-to-face after the many months of attending lessons virtually.

Through the pandemic times, we continued to achieve our vision with focus on the following aspects:

- General Public

We wrapped up the year with 11,753 pujas and events (both online and physical) conducted and saw a total of 449,717 attendees.

COMMUNITY CARE DEPARTMENT (CCD)









The BW Monastery Community Care Department (CCD) was set up in August 2019 as the welfare arm of BW Monastery. CCD's mission is to serve the community through caring for self and others. We envision creating a community of caring individuals who will actively care for others, especially towards the increasing aging population in Singapore. This spirit of giving and volunteering is in-line with Singapore's efforts to help the less privileged and vulnerable.

Our programmes include care pack giving for the less privileged within the Sembawang GRC. These distributions are a meaningful platform for residents to participate and care for their immediate neighbours. Beyond that, CCD currently also runs a Short Term Financial Assistance Scheme (SFAS) for eligible families and individuals. To date, a total of 1,937 families have benefited from our care pack distribution. A total of 20 families have benefited from the SFAS. Aligned with the Buddhism practice of generosity (giving), we strive to continue supporting the community with these efforts.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT









2022 was an exceptionally exciting year for our youths! We found a dedicated space for our youth community near our Monastery. At the new Youth Space, our youths can stay closely connected to the events within the Monastery, and at the same time, have ample space to host youth enrichment lessons/interest groups. Located near the residential area in Woodlands also means that the Youth Department will be able to reach out to young families in the community more easily.

With a floor size of approximately 1800 sqft, the youth space consists of a main stage-cum-studio area, a training room, an altar, a small office and a pantry. The Youth Department conducted a housewarming session on 01 Nov 2022 and welcomed our youths home. We also hosted an end-of-year celebration on 25 December 2022. The feedback gathered were very positive, and many enquired about future activities in 2023. We look forward to all the virtuous learning and training that will take place at our Youth Space!

Children's Class

ZEST UNIVERSE









As the pandemic eased, and social distancing measures were lifted, in-person Zest Universe classes resumed (once a month). The children were excited to finally meet their teachers and friends. Parents were mostly supportive of the return of the physical lessons, as they felt that physical classes were critical in promoting interaction skills in their children.

Looking ahead to year 2023, we hope that more on-site classes and activities can be organised to facilitate learning and strengthen bond between teachers, parents and children. We can now also include physical experiential activities in our curriculum which may aid in better understanding of certain concepts.

Lunar New Year 2022

BRILLIANCE









The Lunar New Year is an important time of the year whereby devotees would welcome the new year by paying respect to all Buddhas, repent past non-virtuous deeds, and make offerings to accumulate more merits and wisdom in the year to come! The Venerables guided the devotees to make positive aspirations for the new year while emphasising the need for everyone to nurture high morals standards and be responsible, caring members of the society to support the stable progress of the country.

The monastery was also beautifully decorated with Chinese lanterns, bringing about vibrant Lunar New Year festive vibes to the neighbourhood and its community. We saw a total of about 6,000 visitors being drawn to the monastery over the Lunar New Year period!

AUSPICIOUS VESAK 2022









Vesak Day is the most important day for Buddhist practitioners. The birth of Lord Buddha Shakyamuni brought Dharma to the world, and countless lost sentient beings found a way of liberation from the cyclic existence.

With the easing of Covid measures, this was the first in-person Vesak celebration since the pandemic. In view of the health and safety of the attendees, the event team designed a "zero-contact" Buddha bathing pool which automatically 'bathed' the Buddha when a devotee approached the pool. There was also an exhibition themed "Our Majestic Sangha". The exhibition illustrated how our Teacher and Sangha followed our Master's legacy and carried out a lifelong journey to propagate the Dharma and benefit all sentient beings. We saw a total of approximately 9,837 devotees who attended the Auspicious Vesak event over just 3 days!

AUSPICIOUS DOUBLE HAPPINESS









"Auspicious Double Happiness" celebrates Singapore's 57th birthday, and the 5th Anniversary since the completion of our Monastery building at Woodlands. This year was made extra meaningful as we crossed into the 20th year since the establishment of our society.

There were three main parts to the celebrations:

(1) Exhibition

Exhibition of photographs and records of our activities/milestones since 2002.

(2) Time Capsule

Created a time capsule containing representative historical objects from the past 20 years, and a book consisting of various sharing from fellow students.

(3) Tree Planting

In line with Singapore's Green Plan 2030 to plant 1 million more trees, 40 people including representatives from the National Parks Board, BW Monastery Board of Directors, cadres and class representatives, participated in the tree planting activity along Woodlands Road.

LUMIERE MOON FEST









BW Monastery organised the Lumiere Moon Festival 2022 to celebrate the Mid-Autumn festival in-person again after having missed it for the past two years. We saw many familiar faces from around the neighbourhood, as well as new faces who joined us for the first time to immerse in the spirits of the festivity. A total of 2,000 participants joined us for the event that was filled with activities.

Visitors were treated to live performances and made positive aspirations/well wishes by decorating colourful lanterns. They also participated in games to learn about the rich culture of Mid Autumn Festival. The event concluded with the distribution of mooncakes and snacks, as well as the prize presentation for the winner of the "Chinese Round Fans Colouring Competition".

AUSPICIOUS LIGHT FESTIVAL









A yearly affair, our year-end countdown event "Auspicious Light Festival & Blessing Puja" is focused on reflecting on our growth in the past year, and welcoming the new year with positivity. The key message for this year is: "Thousand lights with one heart, together we shine".



As a general rule of thumb, the charity has I year of annual operational expenditure kept as reserves. The reserve level is reviewed yearly by the Board to ensure that the reserves are adequate to fulfil the charity's continuing obligations.
